"TECHNICOLOR 1905 GOLD" LOOKS LIKE A GEM, GRADES XF!

Not all people are created equal~sound familiar? Well, neither are notes! It's obvious that NO two notes are identical (even in runs - serial #'s).

Watch auction results...two same notes, same friedberg #'s, same condition, graded by same grading co...one sells at \$17k and the other at \$28k! This just occurred couple weeks ago (remember same grading co!) How can this be and what does it mean to you the Collector/Buyer?

The reason is simple, NO two notes are alike and therefore hold different values, period! You CANNOT, CANNOT Price shop our notes as if they are cars! I've personally viewed "like" notes (same grade and fr.#) and wouldn't bid \$5k for one (that I thought had little to no

"Every note seems to appreciate well, but you want to pick the HORSE that will get around the track in FIRST Place!" Of course, meaning, all notes will probably appreciate well, but if you want to pick the one that performs the best then BUY in the **MAINSTREAM!** The primary function of my day is to Buy and Sell Paper Money, this is what I do, this is what I love, and this is my sole Passion! I indeed, live it, breath it, drink it and sleep it! Many dealers have a multitude of distractions (other careers or businesses).

You have to first decide are Collecting a specific note because it speaks to you and you just want it or are you buying it for that reason plus it's potential? If you're looking for the highest potential, well then, I strongly recommend you Buy in the Mainstream. Below is a list of what I personally have coined:

attraction) and would bid "whatever it takes for the other!" I've also (read closely). Have bid more for an AU note (that has all the appearances of a Ultra Gem) than for a ChCU note (that is crooked, has handling marks, bent corners, very dull surfaces and is lack luster). Sound obvious? It may sound obvious (may not), but still very intelligent people fall into the Grade Number trap!

People will want a certain note, fall in love with it, it looks PERFECT! The problem is, it's priced at a ChCU or above number and it's technical grade is Au-58. We had a recent consignment (sold in 1 day) that is in a CGC-67PQ, it was emailed to three potential buyers. The first said, I like the note, let me think about it at that level. The 2nd guy asked for a large price break and squabbled about the price level and strained to find the logic and the 3rd person said, "I'll take the note, not sure how to pay at this very minute, but know in that grade it's a rarity and the potential is very high!" The point is... (obviously the 3rd guy got the notes) it's tough sometimes to analyze values of notes and to find the logic (based on other closed sales or other notes in varying grading holders) but you really have to analyze more than just the note, but also the market! Do

Now, there are several other (as I call them) "Alternate" notes that are very much in demand and also are First Place notes; however, these notes in many circumstances are either price prohibitive or just extremely rare and/or are very difficult to procure (see below):

1880 \$10's and \$20 "BLACK BACKS!" (\$10 Morris and \$20 Decatur's: Very much in demand, but hard to get)
1860's \$2 Original Series Nationals (Lazy Dueces)
1860's \$1 Original Series Nationals (ACE's)
1880 \$50 Legal Tenders (Liberty w/ Sword)
1869 \$20 Rainbow Note
1918 \$500 Blue Fed. (DeSoto Note and of course the \$1,000 Spread Eagle)
1882 or 1922 \$500 GOLD Note (and of course \$1,000)
1914 RED SEALS: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100

Then there's the "B" LIST (as I like to refer to them) these are notes that are not quite the Hottest, but are certainly in high demand. These notes have always seemed to have performed very well, but not always at the percentages as the "DD" notes (see below):

Blue Feds: \$1, \$2 (Battleship) \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 (\$100 is most popular along with Battleship).
Fr. 40's 1923 \$1 RED Seal (have performed very well, especially over the last year, also very affordable - \$1250 Gem)
Fr. 245/246 1891 \$2 SILVERS (have suddenly become quite difficult to obtain and prices have really popped very high)
First Series - 1862's \$1, \$5, \$10 (these notes are fairly reasonable to obtain both in pricing and access, perform fairly well)
Treasury Notes - 1890 and 1891 (the main denominations that pull are the Deuces and the \$10's)
Manning Notes - 1886 and 1891 \$20 Silver Cert's

PRICE SHOPPING (Cont. from page 2)

For, will it make a difference in 1 yr. Or 3 yrs. or 5 yrs? NO! I personally have paid double and a few times all the way to triple what a notes value was in that "technical grade." I even remember thinking to myself, "Am I burying myself in this note?" The note looked so beautiful, it's just perfect aesthetically, but technically is an AU note....did it matter? NO! Without (without) exception it sold and at a good profit and it pained me to part with the note and the new owner would NOT part with it years later.

In summary, treat every note on its own merit. Don't assume because a \$2 Ed sold in auction (4 mos. Ago) in a pgs 65 holder for \$8800. That for one minute, \$2 Ed's in GEM (Solid Lock GEMS) aren't worth all of \$12.5k to \$13.9k! Don't even assume if you find (3) \$2 Ed's in 65's that sold for \$10k that all they are worth are \$10k!

You need to evaluate each note on both its own merit and the marketplace. I bought a \$1 Rainbow once (in CGC-65PQ) that looked 66 to me. Most importantly, the colors were just beyond expectations and I paid \$6.5k for it -when the market warranted \$5k (but I knew that the pricing on this note was going to soar to \$10k in gem within months. I knew this by knowing how RARE a GEM \$1 Ace Rainbow really is - know the market as well as the note (is the lesson)! More to come in the upcoming months concerning Pricing and the Marketplace!
